
A better tomorrow insight Fighting hunger in Cambodia

What's the challenge?

In Cambodia, young women rarely have access to education – girls make up less than a third of all schoolchildren. The Happy Chandara school, near Phnom Penh, was set up as a pilot for 1,200 girls aged six years and older. But these girls come from families suffering from food shortages and it became clear that – if they were going to come to school rather than working – they would need to be fed. Happy Chandara was able to buy fruit and vegetables but it was a big financial burden for the school.

What are we doing?

Sodexo donated €35,000 to help create new permaculture vegetable gardens at the school. These gardens produce seven tons of fruit and vegetables annually, saving the school almost €18,000 every year.
